Upon redeployment, Major Tavares assumed command of 1-75 Cavalry Regiment and other leaders were deployed as Security Force Advise and Assist Teams (SFAAT) on a deployment to Afghanistan.

Major Tavares currently serves as the Assistant Professor of Military Science at the Louisiana State University with duty at University of Louisiana at Lafayette, where he serves as the Head of the Department of Military Science.
